BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

Scott Carriere, Chairman



The inaugural Board meeting of 2024 featured a comprehensive review of the five preceding Executive Board meetings, during which the activities of MVT were

scrutinized, and plans for the upcoming year were formulated. Noteworthy deliberations in the Executive meetings resulted in the passage of several motions, including the decision to refrain from providing compensation to board members, the elimination of the leash requirement times for the dog park, the approval of Walker Consulting to conduct an evaluation of the parking deck structure, the discontinuation of the lease renewal fee for renters, the referral of the roof anchor project to the Architectural Committee, and the appointment of Jerry Bauer as the Sales and Leasing Director for MVT.

Further clarification is warranted regarding Mr. Bauer's role. It is imperative to note that Jerry Bauer is not an employee of MVT; rather, he will be responsible for managing phone calls and walk-in inquiries from individuals interested in MVT. Importantly, Mr. Bauer, who functions as a real estate agent, will receive compensation solely through standard real estate commission structures. MVT will not direct his activities nor provide him with a fixed salary. Additionally, Mr. Bauer will be renting an office space located in the hallway leading to the Sun Porch. This strategic placement aims to optimize accessibility for individuals seeking information about MVT. Please note, If you have a need for a realtor you are not obligated to use Jerry, you can select any realtor you prefer.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL DO'S & DON'T

Do These Things

- 1. Run your garbage disposal regularly, this prevents rust & corrosion.
- 2. Always run a strong cold-water flow before you turn it on to grind food waste. Keep cold water running until grinding is finished.
- 3. Cut large items into smaller pieces

Don't Do These Things

- 1. Don't pour down grease, oil, or fat
- 2. Don't use hot water when grinding food waste
- 3. Don't grind any of the following: citrus peels, eggshells, banana peels, avocado peels, potato peels, corn husks, celery, onion skins, and artichokes. The list also includes expandable foods like pasta and rice.
- 4. Don't try to grind up peanut butter. Peanut butter is so oily and sticky that the water and the grinder cannot expel it.
- 5. Don't put coffee grounds down a garbage disposal
- 6. Don't use bleach or drain cleaners
- 7. Don't put in anything that is non-biodegradable. Don't ever (that means never) put anything in your disposal that is not biodegradable food.
- 8. Don't use your hand to retrieve

A good rule of thumb is that when in doubt, toss it out (in the garbage) and not down your sink's garbage disposal.
