ADMINISTRATION CORNER

Happy World Pasta Day! I hope this message finds you well and that you have been enjoying the beautiful weather we've had this week.

As I mentioned in the recent

board meeting, it's hard to believe we are already approaching the final months of the year. MVT's busy season is right around the corner. In the coming weeks, owners will receive their "Meet the Candidate" packages along with the annual meeting packet. This year, the annual meeting will include two declaration amendments for voting: one regarding smoking policies and the other to limit the number of rental units in our building. To help navigate this information, we will be hosting floor meetings for each floor for a single week. I will coordinate the specific dates with each floor representative. Additionally, with the assistance of Walker Consultants, we have selected a contractor for the necessary repairs to the parking deck. We anticipate that work will commence within the next few weeks. This project will be executed in two phases: the first phase is expected to last approximately 15-20 weeks, while the second phase will not begin until later in 2025.

Funding for this project will be sourced from our reserves. In November, we will also meet with waterproofing consultants to advance the chase project. Their role will be to evaluate the current issues, develop the necessary drawings, and prepare a bid package. While we do not have definitive cost estimates for the chase repair at this time, preliminary assessments suggest that expenses could fall within the \$7,000 to \$9,000 range. Please note that these figures and the project start date remain tentative, with an anticipated start in spring.

We have also been discussing the installation of roof anchors, which the board approved last week. The addition of roof anchors is essential for routine maintenance and repairs, including sealing and re-caulking windows and brick repairs. Installation is expected to occur this year.

Regarding activities, this week's highrise living series featured the Fire Lieutenant of Sandy Springs. He emphasized the importance of not having items such as candles and space heaters in our condos and provided guidance on safety procedures in the event of a fire.

As stated in our resident manual, in the event of a fire, residents should proceed to the nearest stairwell and make their way down to the courtyard or deck. If unable to descend, you may wait in the stairwell for assistance from the fire department. Alternatively, if reaching the stairwell is impossible, please unlock your door, turn on your balcony light, and wait on your balcony. Sandy Springs has five fire stations, ensuring a quick response. We are also coordinating with the fire department to schedule a fire drill, which they will assist with. Please be advised that failure to participate in fire drills may result in a fine of \$1,000 from the city. Furthermore, if a sprinkler head in your unit fails inspection due to paint or residue, you will be responsible for its replacement.

Looking ahead, the high-rise series on Monday, October 28th, will feature Jody Reichel, who will discuss current city developments. I encourage everyone to attend.

Our Halloween Dinner Party this coming week is sold out! We will announce the winners of both the Costume Contest and the Pumpkin Decorating Contest at 5:45 PM during the event. Pumpkins entered in the contest will be displayed in the front lobby starting today, with voting open through monetary donations placed beside each pumpkin.
