ADMINISTRATION CORNER



Happy Friday! I hope this message finds you well and that everyone has enjoyed a productive week, despite the sudden change in temperature that we have all experienced recently.

As we approach the Thanksgiving holiday next week, I would like to take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude to each one of you. While I did not grow up with a strong tradition of celebrating holidays, I have come to appreciate the significance of Thanksgiving as a time for connection and gratitude. I feel incredibly fortunate to be part of such a wonderful community here at Mount Vernon Towers. I am sincerely thankful for the relationships that I have built here, the laughter we have shared, and the unwavering support I have received over the past several years. This Thanksgiving, I encourage everyone to take a moment to reflect on the joyous moments in your lives, to express love and appreciation to one another, and to cherish the connections you share not only with your families but also with your neighbors within our community.

In this memo, I have several important updates to share with you, organized by department for clarity:

Administration:

The last general session board meeting took place this past Wednesday, and I would like to remind everyone that our next meeting will be the Annual Owners Meeting, scheduled for December 16, 2024, at 7:00 PM. Registration for this meeting will commence at 5:30 PM in the back lobby. The meeting packet, containing all pertinent information, will be distributed to Owners on Monday. I will also be arranging individual floor meetings to discuss the contents of the packet in detail, explain the voting process, and answer any questions you may have.

We have been addressing concerns related to the use of motorized mobility devices within our facility. Recently, I shared the rules that must be followed regarding the operation of these devices. Due to the varying sizes of these devices, it has become increasingly difficult to maneuver them within single elevators without causing damage to the walls and structure. To mitigate this issue, the board has unanimously voted that, effective immediately, all motorized mobility devices must exclusively use the double elevators.

The use of single elevators for these devices is strictly prohibited, and violations of this rule will result in fines.

Additionally, I am aware that some of you have been inquiring about the status of our Comcast situation. We are currently awaiting the finalization of the contract, which is still pending legal approval. Furthermore, we must wait for the availability of the technicians involved in this process. Therefore, we are still in a holding pattern regarding this matter. I trust that everyone is relieved that the election season has come to an end, bringing a cessation to the flood of robocalls and text messages. Personally, I am grateful to no longer be inundated with political signage in my neighborhood. However, this leads me to address the issue of political signs within Mount Vernon Towers. While we respect your right to express your political views through clothing or accessories, we must prohibit the display of political signs on the exterior of your doors that face the common hallway areas. This decision has been vetted by our legal team to ensure that it does not infringe upon anyone's First Amendment rights. If you currently have political signs displayed on your doors, I kindly ask that you remove them immediately.

In employee-related news, I am pleased to announce that Clay from the IT department is being promoted to the position of Assistant Maintenance Clay has been an invaluable asset to our IT team, and while you may miss his presence in that role, he is eager to embrace the challenges that come with learning about the building and its various systems. Please take a moment to congratulate Clay if you see him. We will also be advertising a part-time IT technician as early as this weekend. David Bauder, who has been with us for 17 years and was instrumental in starting the IT program, will continue to serve as the manager of the IT department.

Activities:

I am delighted to share that last night's Pre-Thanksgiving dinner party was a resounding success! It warms my heart to witness residents enjoying themselves, interacting, and dancing together. At one point, we had over 20 residents up and dancing the night away. As we transition into the Thanksgiving holiday next week, you will begin to see the building adorned with early Christmas decorations, a necessary step given the late timing of Thanksgiving this year. We wanted to ensure that we are fully prepared for the upcoming holiday parties.

On Thanksgiving Day, we will be serving brunch, and I want to remind everyone that reservations are required. Reservations began today, and we still have availability. Please contact Susan to secure your spot on the list.

You may have noticed that the Veterans wall has been temporarily taken down but rest assured that all frames and content have been preserved and will be reused in the coming months. In the meantime, I am pleased to announce that the artist alley is back, showcasing the work of Mr. Bob Harnsberger and Ms. Libby Huff. Dining Services:

As I mentioned previously, we recently hired a new Dining Director, Marquita. Unfortunately, I must inform you that she resigned this past week due to personal circumstances that will limit her availability. We are currently back in the interview process for this important position.

I also want to share some exciting news regarding our Executive Chef search. We have been conducting interviews and hosting tasting sessions, and I am thrilled to announce that we have extended an offer to Executive Chef Anthony, who has accepted the position. I will provide more information about him in the coming week, but I was very impressed with his culinary skills, knowledge, and personality during the interview process. You may have noticed the "Happy or Not" kiosk in the dining room, which serves as an alternative to traditional comment cards. This system allows you to provide feedback by clicking on icons or even writing detailed comments if you prefer.

If you still wish to use the comment cards, that option remains available as well, and those comments are manually entered into the system. The beauty of the kiosk is that it compiles all feedback, data, and statistics in real time for me, the management team, and the regional director and vice president of Morrisons. Last week, we received an 85% positive feedback score from 125 responses, along with 38 comments. While we recognize that 85% is not our target, having this data will help us hold ourselves accountable, so please continue to provide your feedback. We need to hear both the positive and the constructive.

Maintenance:

This Tuesday and Wednesday, our maintenance team will be changing filters on floors 1-4 to ensure that our systems are functioning optimally.

In terms of recycling, we have observed instances of shredded paper being bagged in plastic and left on the trash room floor. Please be reminded that this practice is not recyclable due to the combination of plastic and paper. We kindly ask that you refrain from placing these bags on the floor.

Many of you may be accustomed to turning off your HVAC units in your homes to conserve energy when they are not needed. However, I must emphasize that this practice should not be followed in your condos. It is essential that your HVAC units remain on at a comfortable temperature, even if you are away on vacation, to prevent issues such as freezing pipes and mold development.




