Happy Tuesday! I apologize for the delay in sending this update; Monday slipped away from me faster than anticipated.

As many of you know, I departed last Thursday morning in a U-

Haul truck to Swannanoa and Black Mountain, North Carolina. I was fortunate to enjoy a beautiful fall drive for most of the journey. However, upon reaching the small towns affected by the recent hurricane, I was shocked by the extent of the devastation—far worse than I had anticipated after a month had passed. The area resembled a war zone, and it truly broke my heart.

On Thursday, I immediately delivered supplies and began canvassing the area to assess where assistance was most needed. I sorted through unorganized supplies, delivered food and pizzas door-to-door in the impacted communities, and witnessed firsthand that restoring these areas to normalcy will take considerable time and effort. It was difficult to leave knowing there is still so much work to be done, but I plan to return for a Christmas gift drive. needed.

I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to all who generously donated items or funds. Thanks to your swift support, we were able to also meet urgent last-minute needs such as laundry detergent, soaps, space heaters, and air mattresses. I took numerous pictures during my visit, and as many of you have requested, I will attach them to this message.

In terms of maintenance, I am pleased to inform you that the contract for the parking deck repairs has been signed, with the first phase set to begin at the end of this month. In the coming week, I will meet with residents utilizing the undercover parking affected by the initial repairs to discuss parking arrangements. Only those individuals will be notified of the meeting. As a reminder, the barrels and chains on the upper parking deck are in place to block off areas that should not be used until repairs are completed. If you choose to move a barrel and park in those spaces, please be advised that a fine of

\$100.00 will be imposed for the first offense, with increased penalties for repeated violations.

The annual meeting packet will be distributed later this month, followed by individual floor meetings to discuss the contents and related materials.

Lastly, I want to take a moment to acknowledge our exceptional employees. Each year, the residents of Mount Vernon Towers express their gratitude to our non-management staff for their hard work and dedication. Our Maintenance and Housekeeping teams operate behind the scenes to ensure a smooth living experience.

The Personal Care staff provides outstanding care in the Personal Care Center, while the Servers and Kitchen staff create pleasant dining experiences. Our Front Desk staff consistently go above and beyond to assist residents, and the Activities and Transportation personnel work diligently to keep everyone engaged and active.

Historically, the Towers has maintained a no-tipping policy. Instead, we have the "Little Red Box" initiative, with two donation boxes located at the Front Desk and the Dining Room Host Stand. Contributions made to these boxes will go toward the Employee Appreciation Fund, which is distributed to our non-management staff based on their years of service and hours worked. 



